K. In February we were assisted at Surderisle by M. Morand. Robert LeBlanc helped us at Pont Audemer. The Resistance were in a wood there. They had lots of guns and grenades from the British, but did not know how to use them. We showed them how to take apart, clean and fire the guns.

We were helped in Juilly sous Thelle by Marcel Lefevre Mime. DuGonde, 4 RueDaumesnil, Paris, helped us.

In Basloup, near the forest, Arrain Rene and Roger Bernard helped

Jean, the woodsman, was very good and a great assistance.

The French organizations I met on the whole were not wery good. By far the best was in the Foret de Fronteval. The others in general would not let the evaders go on, and were very afraid of betrayal. The leaders and general organization were poor, even if individuals had good enthusiasm and high ideals.
