While on a mission to bomb Bordeaux my plane was hit by flak. I bailed alt just South of Bayas, in ongenne. I was given sheller in the house of a farmer where I was met by a member of the resistance movement who took me to a farmhouse in Lerin et Musset. By this time 4 other members I my crew had joined me. From here we were taken to a maquis headquarters by Jean Meric Meric was a member of the Magnis, and stored a great leal of ammintion on his farm. The rest of our bomber crew met us there. None were missing and all were unhert. We stayed at Meric's to seven days, then were taken to austher farm close by Chetween Lerm ex Musset and Orignold). about 4 days later the germans attached Term et Musset with tracked relicles, killing about 35 magnis. We moved to a woods NE of arignols where we stayed in a camouflaged shack for 24 hrs. The Maquis wanted us to remain with them, but Brooks and I left the next day, and walked to allows. We were wearing our full unform and flying boots From here we worked to Bourriot-Bergance where we stayed in a barn. Other

Maquis took us from here to their headquarters at d'armagnac, where we met an English colonel known as 'Gaston' We went to work for these magnis, Hey issued us arms and Maquis uniforms. The colonel told us it was impossible to get to Spain. We were still determined to try, however, and we left these Maquis on 8 July, after staying with them 121/2 weeks. We hiked to Gan ly way of Eugenie les Bains; Geanne, dryacq, Morlain, and Pau. at Gan we stayed 3 weeks at a farm jist north of town. The form consisted people at the farm were mostly young men and women who were hiding from the Germans for various reasons. The farm was run by Maurice a short, well-built young man with wavy hair. His Dister Dunice (?) was also there Likewise Helène Nadler; Robert (cook); andré a young boy of 16: Margot, an older woman, crippled; Pierke; John, an Englishma known in Gibraltar; Jean Boxalle (real name Jean Ferbussy), a French Io whose Lordon. While here we also met an american girl named Rose Mary and an English girl

hiding from the Germans. They were both "organization" (?) members. Lean Botalle arranged our guides and identity cards. He sent us to Pau later joining us where with new clothes for us.

From here we were were sent, with a series of quiles, across the Pyrenees. We give ourselves up a sew miles inside the Spanish border. We were taken to Pamplona for a police dation where we filled out poutine reports and our money was collected. We were given a receipt for it which was, in turn, collected in bibrattar. From here on our journey was the standard one.

They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.

- 2. You will therefore disclose no information whatever, beyond the fact of your return to duty from "missing in action" or "prisoner of war" or "internment", to anyone except the following military officials:
  - a. The first Military Attache to whom you report;
  - b. An officer designated by the Commanding General of an overseas Theatre of Operations:
  - c. The Prisoner of War Branch, MIS. Washington, D.C., the interrogating agency designated by the A/C of S. G-2, War Department General Staff;
  - d. Certain other officers holding written authority from the A/C of S. G-2, WDGS, to interrogate you.
- 3. You will particularly guard against disclosure of SECRET information to relatives, friends, representatives of the press and radio, and military officials, except as noted in a, b, c and d'above.
- 4. In order to protect yourself against disciplinary action, any question involving publicity must be referred BY YOU PERSONALLY to the A/C of S, G-2, WDGS, Washington, D.C.

#### CERTIFICATE
