I left THURLEIGH BEDS at 1030 hrs on August 8th to bomb enemy Mission troop concentrations in front of our line. At approx 1230 we were turning on our bomb rum when we were hit in the right wing Hit by heavy flak. I heard the engineer say the right wing was ON . on fire and on looking out of the window saw the flames running Flak inside the wing, and the wing beginning to disintegrate. The R. waist gummer baled out and I followed him. On my descent I saw 4 other chutes open out. I landed some two hundred yards N of some woods Sq 770342. ov snew .E This area was being shelled by the British and so I dug myself a shallow foxhole and took cover. I was shelled intermittently Shelled Heavily the whole of the day. I remained there until midday August 9th when I crawled to a deserted farmhouse some hundred yards away. There was an air raid shelter and so I again took cover from the shelling and divebombing. morning of the 15th, (living on my Escape Kit the whole time)
when I was picked up by the British in their advance.
