Amended Instructions Concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War, to Include Evaders of Capture in Enemy or Enemy-Occupied Territory and Internees in Neutral Countries.

- 1. Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in a neutral country, or release from internment not only furnishes useful information to the enemy but also jeopardizes future escapes, evasions and releases.
- 2. Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- 3. Evaders, escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- 4. Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- 5. Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.

Landed safely

24 On June we were forced to bail out near Glanville. In descending I saw only 4 chutes, so Captured later I think that the pilot must have been killed in the plane. The others pulled their ripcords as soon as they were clear of the plane, so the Germans captured them as soon as they hit the ground, so the French told me. I dealyed until 1000 feet. When I hit the ground, I walked about 2 km and then hid in a hedgrerow. Soon I contacted the French, and was moved along by several of them toward Dives, where I intended to get through the lines into the British sector. I went into a house on the Frank of the Diver river where I met 3 Printish on the E bank of the Dives river, where I met 3 British paratroopers. While we were there, the Gestapo raided the house and we left, and crossed the river to a house on the other side. On 6 July we stopped in another house, and found a lot of Germans inside who captured us.

Escaped 10 July and recaptured

We were taken to a prison camp S of Cabourg. There we ascertained the hours for the changing of the guard, and at 0530 on 10 July escaped through a window. I was to meet the other three at a PM because to meet the other three at a RV because we went through the window 5 minutes apart. I was the second. When I reached the rendezvous, the first man wasn't there, I thought that gomething had some whom thought that something had gone wrong, so I went on alone, I went into a field and hid. Up to this time I had never gotten civilian clothes. I thought that my fatigues were sufficient disguise. On 12 July some Germans found me in the field, and I was taken back to the prison from which I had escaped. They put me into solitary confinement for 2 days on bread and water. There was little difference between this and the regular prison conditions.

Second escape successful

On 18 July I was moved to Falaise and then on 21 July to Alencon. I styled at the latter place until 9 August, doing different types of work every day, all directly connected with the German war effort. When I was moved to Sées. The next day I got on a truck detail that was going back to Alençon to get some load.

Some of our planes flew over the truck, and the driver drew to the side of the road and the guards hid veven though the planes never strafed. I escaped and went crosscountry until I contacted a man in the Resistance who took me to his house and kept me until I was overrun by the 5th Armd Div.
