- 1. Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in a neutral country, or release from internment not only furnishes useful information to the enemy but also jeopardizes future escapes, evasions and releases.
- 2. Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- 3. Evaders, escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- 4. Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- 5. Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.

TOP SECRET. 1.S.9 (WEA) (11/4 Made E & E Repor (Applies to all 88/ (AEW) P. S. I. We were attacked by a night bighters at oloohy, 5 July, and plane was set on fire. I rang the alarm bell and we bailed I landed at Merroville at 0100,5 July, about 40 miles 5. of Paris. fighter had been Sting over us in the moonlight. We tried to hide in the clouds, but they were too thin. Coming out of the coulds we thought we had lost the plane, but a burst of fire told us that he still BALT OUT know where we were. No. 2 engine was on fire, and the bomb bay was also on fire except just the front. The radio man tried the extinguisher but JULI it did not work. I rang the alarm bell and at about 6,00 feet we bailed out out over Mereville of 6000 feet. I fonded in a I ran and walked out of the woody swamp, in which I hit until I came to a small town. Three French saw me. I said, Je suis Mericain, but they went off. I hid in a good sized woods until 1100, when I halted GIVEN HELP. a a man with a cart. He went off and came back with wine, food, and also civilian clothes. I was taken from there to a cave, there by bicycle to MEETS 3 OF CREV 12 JULY a house where we was until July 18th. I then moved on to meet Sgt Jones, · Sgt DuBois, and Lt/ Bonnin of my own crew, and John Lafferty, a B-17 pilot, and we all had a big champagne party. Judgoisquo. On the 12th the two sergeants left together. We were shown the graves of Lovelace and Syra, which were covered with flowers. A mass had been VISIT CRAVES OF daid for them. We moved about in houses of the region until July 20, CREW MEMBERS. when we went to Paris, Where we were met and very well taken care of. CREW MEMBERS: It was planned to send us to Spain. All was arranged on August 2nd; but a phone message went wrong and we did not go to the train. Right after this the lines were cut again by the Resistance. We were about to try again on the 9th, but again something went wrong. W felt this was our last chance and were very depressed. U.T.O to noissol bas of .El On August 11 we took the train to Versailles, and started walking GERMAN OFFICEROWN the main road the Chartres, hoping to join the Americans. We got IN RED CROSS VE a lift on a truck, and found on it an excaping French PW. The road was clogged with G rman high officials leaving, all in cars marked with the Red Cross insignia. I do not believe they could all have been in HICLES 2900A the Red Cross. Mostly not. They were hurrying plenty. W lking with the French PW/and Lt/ Bonnin about 10 miles N/ of Chartres we were stopped by a German Captain, who wanted to know why we were HALTED BY GERwe were stopped by a German Captain, who wanted to know why we were walking toward Chartres. I replied, "Mon pere", and the French RV let forth a regular stream of conversation. He was in a hyrry and let us go, MAN CAPTAIN. A.A.A gaibulani analsaying that other soldiers would stop up. They did, but we got by in the same manner, arriving at Chartres about 1800. In Chartres we stayed with friends until the 16th, When the Americans arrived, going by the Cathedral about 0800. They met considerable sniping AMERICANS AT CHARTRES - CATHED) and we joined them later in the day. We were taken to the Division Hq. and gave all the information we could to the G-2, there, It. Col. On July 20 M. Poirier took me and Lt. Bonnin to Paris, where we stayed with Mme. Christol. The organization in Paris was very active and in good spirits, ready to take over the town when the Americans got nearer.
