BALED OUT AND SHOT AT ON JULY 4

I landed on July 4 near SERVILLE, after we had met with heavy Axifire and baled out. The Germans strafed me three times in the air and three times on the ground. I hid in the bushes, cut and stunned. I worked my way later about 5 miles away and lay up for the day. I found a farmer on the 6th who put me up for three days. I was able to see 3 A-20's go down in the area at this time, one had 3 chutes, one 2, and and the other none. 108

On the 9th I went to DREUX and them to NONANCOURT. Finally Jolia co (and in moved to stay with a farmer who kept me until August 17th.

On that day the French contacted the Americans for me, and at JOINSSAMERICANS 1500 Tobicycled down the road with one of them, guarded by Resistance every 3-400 yands, who gave me the clear signal. , by rejaming the Lines and joined the American troops. I was interrogated by Division, Corps and Army G-2 and did the best I could to give them information.
