- Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in a neutral country, or release from internment not only furnishes useful information to the enemy but also jeopardizes future escapes, evasions and
- Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or 2. communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- Evaders, escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.

- Information about your escape or your evasion from capture would be useful to the enemy and a danger to your friends. It is therefore SEGRET.
- You must therefore not disclose, except to the first Military Attache to whom you report, or to an officer designated by the Commanding General of the Theater of Operations, or by A. C. of S., G-2, W. D.
  - (1) The names of those who helped you.
  - (2) The method by which you escaped or evaded.
  - (3) The route you followed.
  - (4) Any other facts concerning your experience.
  - You must be particularly on your guard with persons representing the press.
  - You must give no account of your experiences in books, newspapers, periodicals or in broadcasts or in lectures. You must give no information to anyone, irrespective of nationality, in letters or in conversation, except as specifically directed in Par. 4.
  - No lectures or reports are to be given to any unit without the permission of A. C. of S., G-2, W. D., or corresponding organization in the

theater.

Our whole Group of 48 planes was on a mission of area support over Dreux at about 19000 feet, when we spotted six Me 109s off to the south east. We went after them, but engine trouble developed and forced me to turn back. Then my oil pressure dropped just as one Me 109 came in to attack me. He got one hit in my right fuel tank, I went into a spin, and then upon recovering, my left; wing fell off. A : Next my rear fuselage tank

blew up, and I bailed out at about 2000 feet.

I landed in a clearing in a forest about 50 yards from where the ship had crashed, started to bury my chute, and then saw a 22 year-old French boy beckoning me to come. We ran about 200 yards due southeast, spotted two German soldiers on the road going towards the plane, and then hid under a log. I stayed there until about 1730, listening to Germans search the neighborhood all the time, and then the boy's father and another man came and brought me clothes and led me to a farmhouse about a mile from Monfort-Americans came into town. Then I walked out and contacted Troop E of the 121st Cavalry Reconnai sance Squadron, and they told me to wait there for a ride back to the Americans. Three days later an armored car from the 106th Gavalry took me back to Group Headquarters at Gousanville, from where I was taken to the XV Corps Headquarters at Magnanville, thence to the Headquarters of the Third United States Army, and finally to the PWE at Courtalain where I was received by LS9 (WEA).
