I stayed in Pont de Ruan which is located between montbagon and Agay to Rideau. There was a German training camp about 15 kil south of there. Pont de Ruan, monthagon and Agayle Rideau have been liberated by the 77 To and many small towns in That section also have been liberated. By liberated I mean the Germans have moved out and the arned patrols on the road and in the towns seen about three hundred German troops march thru the town one day most of them looked very young. This was in July At night the Germans would drive Three The town with trucks, tanks and his guns, Not very many at a time but a few each night, most of them going North. In the evening and early south mornings I saw many German SS troops on likes going North also. They would be in small bunches of from Othirty on down. At the time I left the nearest German were 30 at 40 kil to the south where there were supposed to be several thousand.

2nd Lt. Ray L. Stewart 0 -756920 24 Jun - 8 Sept On the 24th June 1944 my plane was hit by flak. I bailed out and landed in a woods about 10 miles E of Pont de Ruan (INDRE & LGIRE) where I was surrounded by French who took me to a house. I was hidden in the woods and fed. I remained in the woods until the following morning when a M. Delancourt (spelling may be wrong) came for me and took me in his car to his chateau in the vicinity. I stayed here for 6 days, hiding in the woods during the day and sleeping in the chateau at night. He was leader of a group of men. He was accidently shot in the leg and an FFI Captain took over command of his men. M. Delancourt and 2 Frenchmen took me by cycle to the Hotel de Grande Bretagne in Pont de Ruan . The proprietress was Mme. Bourne who worked with the FFI and helped evaders. I stayed here a month and then spent 4 days in the nearby house of Mme. Grenez. I stayed a further week with Mme. Bourne and then a M. De Levant, a Resistance leader from Bordeaux, took me back to the chateau. I stayed here 10 days during which time I went out with M. Delancourt on sabotage missions. Then M. Delancourt's servant Took ME to Mme. Bourne's Hotel . On the 4th September M. Bourne, a Lt. in the FFI and 2 other Frenchmen drove me to Tours from

On about the 15th August Mme. Bourne induced 2 Polish and 2 Czech soldiers in the German Army who had stopped at the Hotel to give themselves up to the local FFI.

A Red Cross woman whom I met in D'Azay-PedRideau (Indre et Loire) told me that Harry Owens was burried in Tours.

- 1. Because disclosures of information regarding evasion from capture, escape, details of imprisonment, release from internment, and repatriation have been made, the lives and services of fellow soldiers and those who help them have been lost or endangered. All information which you possess on these subjects, including the experiences of others as well as your own, briefings and equipment for evasion and escape, and preparations and other activities in connection therewith, constitutes MILITARY INFORMATION which is classified SECRET by the War Department.
- 2. You will therefore disclose no information whatever, beyond the fact of your return to duty from "missing in action" or "prisoner of war" or "internment", to anyone except the following military officials:
 - a. The first Military Attache to whom you report;
 - b. An officer designated by the Commanding General of an overseas Theatre of Operations;
 - c. The Prisoner of War Branch, MIS, Washington, D.C., the interrogating agency designated by the A/C of S, G-2, War Department General Staff;
 - d. Certain other officers holding written authority from the A/C of S, G-2, WDGS, to interrogate you.
- 3. You will particularly guard against disclosure of SECRET information to relatives, friends, representatives of the press and radio, and military officials, except as noted in a, b, c and d above.
- 4. In order to protect yourself against disciplinary action, any question involving publicity must be referred BY YOU PERSONALLY to the A/C of S, G-2, WDGS, Washington, D.C.

CERTIFICATE

I certify that I have read and fully understand all of the foregoing and the Directive of the Secretary of War, 6 Aug 43 (on the reverse side), and will at ALL TIMES hereafter comply fully therewith.

Amended Instructions Concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War, to Include Evaders of Capture in Enemy or Enemy-Occupied Territory and Internees in Neutral Countries.

TO:

The Commanding Generals,

Army Ground Forces; Army Air Forces;

The Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area;

The Commanding Generals,

Theaters of Operations;

Defense Commands;

Departments;

Base Commands;

The Commanding Officers.

Base Commands;

Director, Bureau of Public Relations.

- 1. Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in a neutral country, or release from internment not only FURNISHES USEFUL INFORMATION TO THE ENEMY but also JEOPARDIZES FUTURE ESCAPES, EVASIONS AND RELEASES.
- 2. Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- 3. Evaders.escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, 6-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- 4. Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- 5. Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.
