Our target was Schweinfurt, Germany. I was leading the high squadron of the low group and saw no escorting fighters. Shortly after crossing enemy coast we were hit hard by fighters and lost 2 motors on the left side. No one was injured so I gave the order to prepare to bale out, we then dropped under our formation. After waiting two minuted I baled out from the nose. Bomb bay was closed and the bombs were on board. I tried to free fall until I counted to 60. When air came appreciably warmer, I pulled the cord. Of the 8 chutes I saw I was the first on the ground. After landing I dropped my chute and most of my equipment. I heard motorcyclin the distance and ran about 300 yrds to hide bheind a hedge. I was in hiding when the nearest chute hit the ground.

For three days and three nights I lay behind the hedge and was brought food by a putch boy. On the fourth evening, about daek, a man came and took me to a fam, where he said I should dispose of clothing and shoes. He gave me civilian clothes and took me to where I remained until I was liberated. Moastrich Holland.

Another American, I.t. S. Alukinis joined me, but three days later he was taken away. On April 18th 1944 I decided to move, as I was receiving no help. I decided to start aloneand walked to the putch-Belgian border and looked it over. After spotting a couple of Germans I went back to Maschrite. I asked for help but wasunable to get anything, but blank looks. That night I returned to the home where I had been staying. From that time on no one knew I was there except Alukinis. Even the neighbors on boths sides of me were unaware that I was hiding there. I went outside three times during my stay in Mastrich. On Christmas Eve. New Years Eve, and April 18th.

I was briefed on escape and evasion in England and in the U.S.

Mademoisselle PINKAS Brusselschweg 120 Maastricht, Holland.

Mademoisselle Pinkas had at one time been connected with an organization helping airmen, but she severed these connections when many in the organization were captured by the Gestapo. She continued, however, to help Jewish refugees. Most of her work seemed to be with the Jews who were hiding frim the Germans. She traveled a great deal and was always gone guring the day. She was of Czech. nationalty

SUBJECT:

Amended Instructions Concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War, to Include Evaders of Capture in Enemy or Enemy-Occupied Territory and Internees in Neutral Countries.

TO:

The Commanding Generals.

Army Ground; Army Air Forces:

The Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area;

The Commanding Generals,

Theaters of Operations; Defense Commands; Departments; Base Commands:

The Commanding Officers,

Base Commands;

Director, Bureau of Public Relations.

1. Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in a neutral country, or release from internment not only furnishes useful information to the enemy but also jeopardizes future escapes, evasions and releases.

- 2. Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- 3. Evaders, escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- 4. Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- 5. Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.

- 1. Information about your escape or your evasion from capture would be useful to the enemy and a danger to your friends. It is therefore SEGRET.
- 2. a You must therefore not disclose, except to the first Military Attache to whom you report, or to an officer designated by the Commanding General of the Theater of Operations, or by A. C. of S., G-2, W. D.
  - (1) The names of those who helped you.
  - (2) The method by which you escaped or evaded.
  - (3) The route you followed.
  - (4) Any other facts concerning your experience.
  - You must be particularly on your guard with persons representing the press.
  - You must give no account of your experiences in books, newspapers, periodicals or in broadcasts or in lectures.
- d You must give no information to anyone, irrespective of nationality, in letters or in conversation, except as specifically directed in Par. 4.

  No lectures or reports are to be given to any unit without the permission of A. C. of S., G-2, W. D., or corresponding organization in the

theater.

GERTIFIGATE

I understand that any information concerning my escape or evasion from capture is SEGRET and must not be disclosed to anyone other than the agency designed by A. C. of S., G-2, War Department, the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations, or to the Military Attache in a neutral country to whom I first report. I understand that disclosure to anyone else will make me liable to disciplinary action.
