Amended Instructions Concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War, to Include Evaders of Capture in Enemy or Enemy-Occupied Territory and Internees in Neutral Countries.

The Commanding Generals,

Army Ground;

The Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area;

The Commanding Officers,

Director, Bureau of Public Relations.

- Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in a neutral country, or release from internment not only furnishes useful information to the enemy but also jeopardizes future escapes, evasions and
- Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- Evaders, escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383,6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.

- Information about your escape or your evasion from capture would be useful to the enemy and a danger to your friends. It is therefore SEGRET.
- You must therefore not disclose, except to the first Military Attache to whom you report, or to an officer designated by the Commanding 2. General of the Theater of Operations, or by A. C. of S., G-2, W. D.
 - (1) The names of those who helped you.
 - (2) The method by which you escaped or evaded.
 - (3) The route you followed.
 - (4) Any other facts concerning your experience.
 - You must be particularly on your guard with persons representing the press.
 - You must give no account of your experiences in books, newspapers, periodicals or in broadcasts or in lectures.
 - You must give no information to anyone, irrespective of nationality, in letters or in conversation, except as specifically directed in Par. 4. No lectures or reports are to be given to any unit without the permission of A. C. of S., G-2, W. D., or corresponding organization in the

theater.

Mend, John B. CAPT. 0-733073 2638 801st Bm. 406 Sqdn. m 19 6 May -OK 8 Nov. Ay 80. I bailed out of aircraft and landed between Marsigny and Chency le Chatel. I hurisd my parachule and equipment and proceeded in a southerly direction. about 21/2 hrs later I passed through Chency to Chatel and a bit beyond near the rullage of VIVANS. It was just becoming light so I stopped at a form house. The Jarmer was Mr Bion, Vivans, Loise, France. His daughter Morionette wient to get a member of the underground. I stayed at the form for three days and was contacted by Br. agent Dodo" (John H. Coleman, J. RNA I was moved from the form to the home of M. Genet, 74 Rue Clasmont, Roanne, Joine. at this time while I was awaiting Special Orders to work with the Br. agent. I went with a number of Maquio to recline parachite armo and supplies. While there I contacted my Droup. after 15 or 20 days my orders came thru' and I moved to the home of a Civil Engeneer, M- Bassinard, Rue de Paris, Roanne. I began working with another Br. agent Robert Lyon known as Digi". We established an arms depat in Roanne where I worked preparing guns and atter equipment for use by the maguis. While al was at this house I met It. Reitmeier, now. If out onew who had been brought to us

for help. after 10 days we moned all prepared eguipment to a new Magnis Hg. 16 km. South east of Roanne and there established "Maquis Violette". The FFI name of which was Droupe de Frangy: my job with this group was organizational and training, Instructing them in the use of american armo, ammunition and equipment and basic field training. Sabotage activities mere carried out from this Hg. by Rodo" and Digi". I stayed behind commanding Hg. as a place of refuge for the Saboteurs. We received parachutes here on July 15th containing complete equipment. On July 25th our Hg. was approached by 15-20 Vichy militia but action did not follow. On July 26 th we moved our 2/g. 9 km to the south east and two days later we received word that our position was heing attacted by a force of from two to four hundred men. Composed of Vieny militia, S. M.R. and Dermans. Ot 11:15 our forces went surrounded. do I was C.O. in charge I ordered out men & attack a weak side of the circle. We loroke their and our forces escaped to the South . Only two men were killed. He had made arrangement for a later mendegrous. while of was escaping from this action I was aided by a M. Bonoir, St. Polgues, Joine who later aided It. Reitmeise.

We aregrouped at Ric de Rochefort and split into salvatage sections of 15 mm lach. I went with the north section stationed near Marsigny where a section of the Morsigny FFI was also placed under my On aug. 15 in company with Ligi our group blew up a section of track and R.R. budge near Changy. On aug. 21, the Germans were evacuating Roanne. Digi assembled all groups and attempted to intercept a German column leaving Roanne on fort. We contacted the enemy meat Tarane but only slight action resulted. On aug. 22 a telegram was reclived neading. In form It. Mead present work not in line of duty" so I returned to Roanne which was by this time clear of the enemy. On Sept. 5th of went from Roanne to Lyon which had also been evacuated by the Termans. and from Tyon of proceeded to the nearlest american air bose at ambierieu on Sept. 6th 1944.
