SUBJECT: Safeguarding of P/W Information.

TO : Personnel concerned.

1. It is the duty of all Americans to safeguard information which might, either directly or indirectly, be useful to the enemy.
2. It is an offense, carrying heavy penalties, to publish or to communicate to any unauthorized person any information which might be useful to the enemy.
3. Information about your escape or your evasion from capture would be useful to the enemy and a danger to your friends. It is therefore SECRET.
4. a. You must therefore not disclose, except to the first Military Attaché to whom you report, or to an officer designated by the Commanding General of the Theater of Operations:
 - (1) The names of those who helped you.
 - (2) The method by which you escaped or evaded.
 - (3) The route you followed.
 - (4) Any other facts concerning your experience.b. You must be particularly on your guard with persons representing the press.
c. You must give no account of your experiences in books, newspapers, periodicals or in broadcasts or in lectures.
d. You must give no information to anyone, irrespective of nationality, in letters or in conversation, except as specifically directed in Par. 4a.
e. No lectures or reports are to be given to any unit without the permission of the War or Navy Department.

SUBJECT: Amended Instructions Concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War, to Include Evaders of Capture in Enemy or Enemy-Occupied Territory and Internees in Neutral Countries.

TO: The Commanding Generals,
Army Ground;
Army Air Forces;
The Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area;
The Commanding Generals,
Theaters of Operations;
Defense Commands;
Departments;
Base Commands;
The Commanding Officers,
Base Commands;
Director, Bureau of Public Relations.

1. Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in a neutral country, or release from internment not only furnishes useful information to the enemy but also jeopardizes future escapes, evasions and releases.

2. Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.

3. Evaders, escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attachés are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.

4. Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.

5. Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.

Begin with millideg.

ON SEPT. 6, 1943 we left the Amstelshoek
airdrome, AT 0530 To bomb Stuttgart Germany.
we were flying in #4 position lead sqdn.
Dawn was just breaking and we used
Albus lamps for the assembly. The
day was clear and visibility good
in England.

arrived 8 AM.
we crossed the coast and headed
for Stuttgart. Our PHT + spit
escort had left us only five
minutes when we were hit by
FW190 fighters. They were
not very aggressive and
no battle damage was done.
These were sighted between
Paris + Orleans.

we made for Stuttgart with
the undercast getting heavier
as we hit Germany. Arriving
at Stuttgart we met about

10 Fw's and some very accurate
flak. At the I.P. ^{now over town} #4 Engine
was knocked out and a large
hole appx. 2FT. shot in our
left wing. Still holding formation
we continued the run. The target
was completely obscured so we
circled and made a run on
an unknown Town. Our ^{no} #4 H
Engine wouldn't feather so
it was wind-milling. After dropping
our bombs we encountered a
few more fighters and trouble
developed in #3 engine. The
formation began drawing away
and in about 10 minutes we
met our first heavy wave of
fighters at about 20,000 FT.

They came in from 11 + 1 high + low
7-5 high + low in pairs we estimated
between 28 and 30 fighters were on

us. At this time our Tail gunner
Robert Ammerall was wounded
by 20 mm. Thru. the groin. II
Our ball Turret gunner Barney
Becker got one E/F on the
137 attack. Then they shot out
the hydraulic system in the Ball
Turret got hit and flooded the
Turret, so Barney was forced to
abandon it. The right hand
oxygen system went out and

this and pressed much closer

Twelve o'clock and it looked like he was bent on crashing us I simply held the gun on him and at about a hundred yds from us he flew into millions of pieces. Seconds after this #2 prop ran away and ~~sounded~~ sounded like a siren. The ship began vibrating very bad. The cowling came off and we could see white hot metal dripping from it finally the prop came off and went up over the wing not touching the ship.

Just before this LT Shilliday got a fighter and a few seconds later he got another. I also got one more which spun down in smoke i was to busy to follow him to the ground but am sure from later reports that we accounted

for 5 E/A.

With only one engine left
and both turrets + tail guns out,
and a fire in #2 our situation
was becoming hopeless. The pilot
gave orders to abandon ship.

The intercom was unharmed and
the armor gunner asked for a
few seconds to toss the tail
gunner out. The asst. engineer
helped him. They set him
back to the door, put his hand
on his chute and rolled him
out. The asst. eng. followed
immediately and both chutes opened.

The ship was abandoned in
this order: Navigator, asst radio,
tail gunner, asst. eng. armor gunner,
Bombarier, Engineer I I

Pilot co-pilot

as the armor gunner stepped
out of the ship he was hit by
20mm in right ankle. The only
hatches used were main + nose
hatches. (Pilot's orders)

(I know this because saw him on the ground 2nd runner)

Before jumping i went up
into cockpit to check on injuries
pilot + copilot were OK and
ship flying level on R.F.C.E.
The pilot ask me if we were
on fire? yes - he said OK we
have everything under control and
will be down in a minute. I
yelled good-luck and went feet
first thru the nose hatch. The
alt. was between 15,000 + 14,000
and as there was fighters still
around so i had already decided
on a delayed jump. The first
sensation was of terrific speed as
the slip stream hit me. Then it

as it was to have stood.

seemed as though i had stopped falling and was floating through the air. By doubling up i could summer salt. I was astounded to find that by flexing different muscles i could control my position completely. When i could clearly see a horse and man plowing in a field i pulled my ripcord and the chute popped immediately. I was wearing low cut oxfords and as i landed i cracked my right ankle. I recommend that all men wear high shoes to give all ^{the} protection possible.
