I was top turret gunner in the crew from which Lts BURLEY and GLATTHAR and Sgts SAMGOWCHIAN, SHECK, and HAMRICK have returned. I was wounded on our way to SCHWEINFURT. When the order came to bail out, I jumped out the nose. I think that the pilot, co-pilot, and radio operator were the only ones left in the ship.

I landed on a path in a woods, pulled my parachute from the trees, and the hid it and my lae West behind some bushes. I walked through the woods and hid beside a road, approached an old man by himdelf. He rushed me to his house and gave me some civilian clothes.

Within half an hour my journey was arranged. In the course of it I received medical attention for my fractured skull.

They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
