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PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During May 1969, the 11th Marine Regiment continued to provide supporting fires for the 1st Marine Division in defense of the Danang Vital Area and in other operations in Quang Nam Province. In addition, continued support was provided for Division Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, USN, CIDG, KMC and ARVN forces.

On 12, 20 and 27 May the enemy attacked 3d Battalion, 11th Marines CP area by fire using his relatively newly developed technique of catapulting dud ordnance. The method remains the same: artillery shells or bombs are refitted with a new fuze, a small launch hole is dug, a launching charge is prepared. The bomb is placed over the charge and aimed toward the target and the charge is detonated.

The enemy apparently remains interested in the Dai La Pass area, as indicated by his attack on the Battery H, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines position on 19 May 1969. This attack, like the one in February was a combined sapper-infantry assault by the 31st NVA Regiment. Battery H and infantry security personnel repelled the attack, killing 16 enemy in the wire, capturing 5 prisoners, 6 - AK-47's, 2 - 40 lb. shape charges, 4 - RPG Launchers, 7 - RPG rounds, 7 - Bangalore Torpedoes, and 180 Chicom Grenades, while suffering only five minor wounded.

On 2 May at 1800, Battery D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines fired on 6 VC in boats, grid BT 002524, resulting in 6 VC KIA and 2 boats destroyed; the mission was observed by recon team (RING BROOM). On 9 May at 0635, Batteries D and F, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines fired on 100 VC in the open, grids AT 884535 and AT 888528, resulting in 9 KIA; the mission was observed by an observer from 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. On 20 May at 0500, Battery C, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines fired a contact mission at grid AT 997581, resulting in 20 KIA; the mission was observed by an observer from 39th ARVN Ranger Battalion.

Artillery fires accounted for 164 of the 965 enemy killed within the Division Area of Operations. A total of 156,901 rounds were expended on 12,671 missions during the month.

Operation Oklahoma Hills terminated at 1800 on 29 May. The operation was supported by 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support of the 7th Marines. For details of Operation Oklahoma Hills see enclosure (1) to Appendix 6 to Annex C.

Operation Pipestone Canyon commenced on 27 May. The operation is supported by 1st Battalion, 11th Marines in direct support of the 1st Marines. For details of Operation Pipestone Canyon see enclosure (1) to Appendix 5 to Annex C.

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Improved Conventional Munitions (FIRECRACKER) continued to be employed throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. The Regiment fired 55 FIRECRACKER missions during the month accounting for 62 VC/NVA KIA. All surveillances represent confirmed KIA's and do not include additional probable KIA's. Total FIRECRACKER expenditure for the month was 823 rounds.

On 17 May at 1110, Battery K, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines fired a FIRECRACKER mission on 20 NVA, grids AT 885375 and AT 878377, resulting in 17 KIA and 2 secondary explosions. The mission was observed by recon team (STONEPIT). On 19 May at 1815 Battery K, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines and Platoon B, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery fired a FIRECRACKER mission on 70 VC in open, grid AT 884374, resulting in 35 KIA. The mission was also observed by recon team (STONEPIT).

Unannounced counter-rocket drills continued during the month. Chart operators, observation post personnel, fire direction centers and gun crews derived benefit from the drills.

The enemy initiated four rocket attacks during the month. The targets included the Danang Air Base, III MAF, 210th Ordnance Detachment, MAG 17, and Marble Mountain Air Facility. The average artillery reaction time for counter-rocket fire during these attacks was approximately three minutes.

2. Intelligence

a. During the month of May enemy attacks against artillery units decreased from the previous reporting period. A total of 5 small arms fire, 2 mortar, 3 catapulted bomb and 1 rocket attack were reported for the month.

b. The following significant incidents took place during the month of May 1969:

- (1) 120145H: 3/11 (AT 967617) received one 250 lb. catapulted bomb.
- (2) 200130H: 3/11 (AT 967617) received what appeared to be a catapulted bomb.
- (3) 200400H: 3/11 (AT 967617) received approximately 20 82mm mortar rounds.
- (4) 200650H: A/1/11 (BT 013627) received 5 or 6 82mm mortar rounds.
- (5) 201147H: 2/11 (An Hoa) received ten 140mm rocket rounds.
- (6) 272300H: 3/11 (AT 967617) received two 250 lb catapulted bombs.

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3. Organization and Operations. Units of the Regiment participated in two operations in the Danang area during the month of May 1969. These were:

- a. Operation PIPESTONE CANYON, 27-31 May 1969. APPENDIX 5 to ANNEX C.
- b. Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS, 1-29 May 1969. APPENDIX 6 to ANNEX C.

4. Training

a. Forward observer training for non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. Recipients of this training were personnel from Division Scout Sniper School, Combined Action Group and 11th Motor Transport Battalion. A total of 250 students received two hours of classroom instruction and from four to six hours of practical application.

b. Two officers and 17 enlisted Marines attended in-country Division level schools and eleven enlisted Marines attended out-of-country schools.

5. Logistics

a. During the month of May logistics support was provided by this Headquarters for both Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS and PIPESTONE CANYON.

b. Early during the reporting period, the Regiment completed a build-up to 12 days of ammunition on position. This build-up was accomplished utilizing organic vehicles in all but a few instances.

c. Supporting operational firing commitments, the Regiment was augmented with 40 Tractor-Trailers for the transport of over 200,000 tons of munitions to various positions in the Division TAOR. In addition, 7 Low-Boys were provided for the movement of heavy equipment.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines

The Da Son Clinic treated 1166 Vietnamese during the month of May. Two children were referred and admitted to the FLC Children's Hospital. Dependents and relatives of patients in the USOM Hospital and the German MS HEIGOLAND are furnished transportation on each Sunday and Wednesday during visiting hours. A buffet meal was served to the students of the Elementary School on 28 May in honor of the graduating class. Material was delivered to assist in repairing the damage to the elementary school caused by the ASP #1 explosion on 27 April.

7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines AO Unit flew 82 sorties during the month of May in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units, for a total of 255.6 hours of aircraft flight time and 132.2 hours of AO on-station time.

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During the month of May the AO unit was supported by light observation helicopters attached from A Company, 123rd Aviation Battalion, Americal Division, USA which provided 132.2 hours of on-station flight time. In addition, HU-1E gunships from the 282nd Aviation Battalion were provided as cover aircraft and flew a total of 123.4 hours in support of the 11th Marines AO unit.

It is estimated that approximately 16.5 hours of scheduled flight time was lost due to cancellation of 11 scheduled missions. The primary reason for cancellation can be attributed to aircraft maintenance requirements and weather.

The unit encountered five (5) ground fire incidents resulting in two aircraft being hit and one Army pilot WIA (Med-Evac). No serious damage was sustained by either aircraft.

8. Northern Sector Defense Command

Northern Sector Defense Command is a rear area defense organization commanded by the Commanding Officer, 11th Marines. During the month of May, Condition III was set 20 times, and Condition II was set 11 times.

There were 84 day time recon and 32 day time combat patrols. There were 1 night time recon and 120 night time combat patrols, and 120 night time ambushes. The total patrols and ambushes for the month of May was 357.

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Two movies were shown with an average attendance of 165 Vietnamese civilians. Two movies are scheduled for June. Distribution of appropriate leaflets and Vietnamese language newspapers will continue in June.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
